

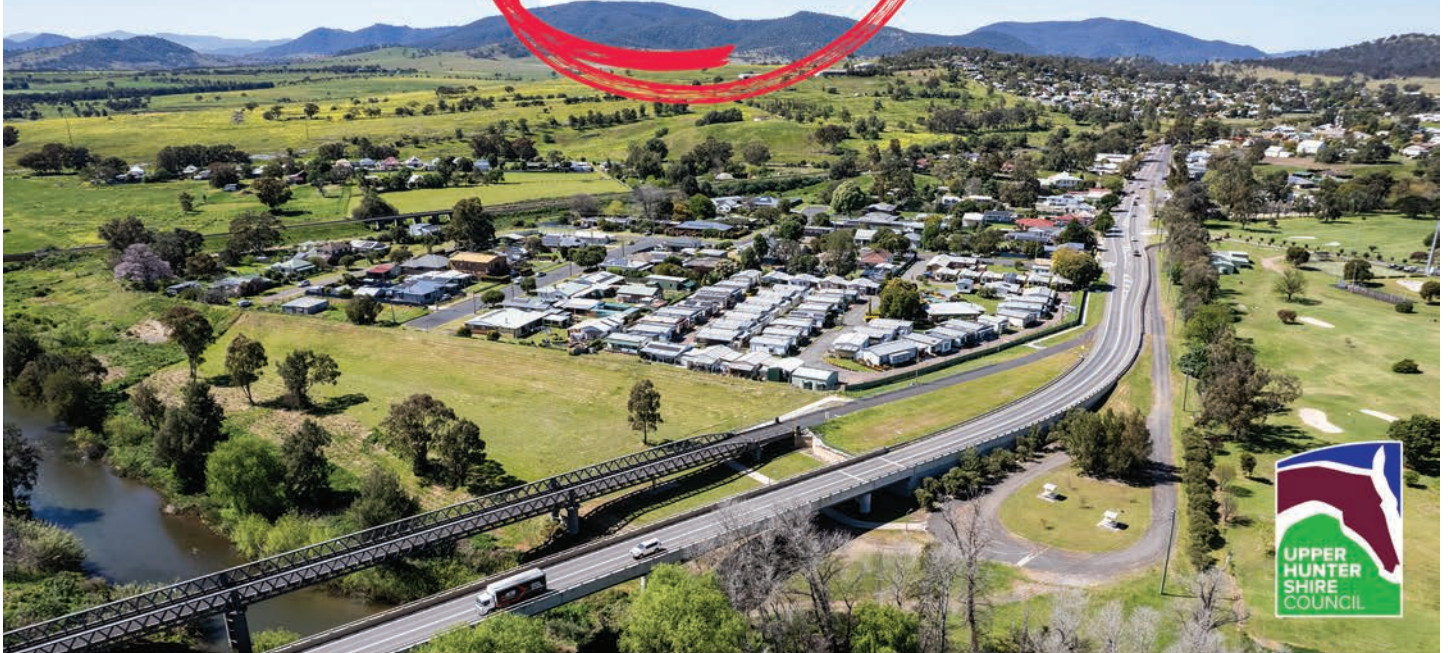

# Council Notes (part one)

Upper Hunter Shire Council held its first ordinary meeting of the new Council, marking the start of a term focused on building a resilient, connected community. The meeting celebrated significant achievements and approved several important projects set to benefit the region. Key outcomes include:

### HONOURING 30 YEARS OF SERVICE – SIMON WALMSLEY

Council proudly recognised Simon Walmsley for his 30 years of dedicated service. Simon, a third-generation member of the Walmsley family serving the Merriwa community, started his career as a Water & Sewer Operator in 1994 with the former Merriwa Shire Council. Now Water & Sewer Supervisor, Simon oversees crucial infrastructure for Merriwa, contributing significantly to our local community.

### CELEBRATING YOUNG LEADERS –MAYOR FOR A DAY COMPETITION WINNERS

Council welcomed winners of the Mayor for a Day competition, an initiative for Local Government Week that encourages young people to share ideas for enhancing their communities. This year's young Deputy Mayor delivered a heartfelt speech to Councillors on supporting animals at the local shelter, highlighting the compassion and dedication of our Shire's future leaders.

### COUNCIL MEETING SCHEDULE AND COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

Council confirmed its upcoming meeting schedule and appointed Councillors to various positions within the Corporate Services, Environmental & Community Services, and Infrastructure Services Standing Committees, ensuring continued focus on the community's priorities.

### APPROVAL OF KEY DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

Council endorsed several development projects aimed at enhancing facilities across the Shire:

- **Scone Airport Expansion:** Approved construction of new hangars, a workshop, and taxiways, expanding functionality while preserving historical features with the relocation of a vintage Bellman Hangar
- **White Park Arena Extension:** Approved an extension to White Park Arena to add covered cattle yard space and a water tank, reinforcing White Park as a leading equine and event venue
- **Campbell's Corner Library Project:** Council approved the next progression of the Campbell's Corner Library project. The major development will involve staged renovations, including internal alterations and fit-out to create modern library facilities and public spaces

## Bird Counts and Rewilding

In this episode Doctor Dirt, I cover the important data collection of Aussie Bird Counts and Rewilding. It's the end of October, the count is in, no it's not Halloween the sights of Count Dracula, it is far more important than that. It's the Aussie Bird Native Bird Count. The health of an environment is measured through many types of data collection and assessments. One of the most reliable and rather easier to collect is Bird Counts, which measure the presence, numbers, and range of species. Woodland Bird Counts are strong indicators of the condition of the environment. The Aussie Bird Count is conducted each year in October. This year it was conducted between the 14th and 20th of October. It involves any willing participants to take 20 minutes on each of these days and record the bird species and the numbers observed. The bird count recorded by enthusiasts and property owners was 43,140,73 this year. Yes, over 43 million native birds.

I have turned my half-hectare house block into a haven for wildlife. Planting native trees, shrubs and ground cover. The plants include a wide range of number of flowering native plants, prickly/thorny shrubs for small bird protection, and berry/fruit producing plants. I have areas of native grasses that provide a source of seed for finches. The wide number of species flower and fruit at various times of the year provides a source of feed over a prolonged period. I also provide various watering points such as ponds and raised bird baths. This is the list of birds have seen in my garden over the past 6 months. Zebra Finches, Double Bar Finches, Yellow Thornbills, Superb Fairy Wrens, Rainbow Lorikeets, Musk Lorikeets, Galahs, Corellas, Sulphur

Crested Cockatoos, Pee Wees, Magpies, Currawongs, Brown Honey Eaters, Blue Faced Honey Eaters, Noisy Friar Birds, Red Wattlebirds, Striped Honey Eaters, Spiny Checked Honey Eaters, White-checked Honey Eaters, Silveryeyes, Crested Pigeons, Black Faced Cuckoo Shrikes, Pied Butcherbirds, Grey Butcherbirds, Australian Ravens, Plovers, Brown Falcons, Brown Kites, Swifts, Eastern Barn Owls, Tawny Frogmouths, Nankeen Kestrels and Blackbird introduced to Australia in 1850s. Unfortunately, Indian Miners and introduced species occasionally visit. There are species such as the Brown Honey Eater taking up permanent residence. A species not recorded in our area before.

I do not understand why more people do not undertake Rewilding. Rewilding is a term to bring back native ecosystems. It is important to closely align native plants that would originally be in our landscape and not plant species that are known to invade bushlands. You may think it's nice to plant foreign-based plants but why not make it a habitat for our wildlife? At least establishing some native plants will improve the area instead of having a sterile landscape. There have been recently 30,000 native plants/trees planted in Southwest Metropolitan Sydney, the immediate goal is 170,000 natives to be established in the Rewilding Project. This is designed to connect native vegetation where they can. So please join me, make a difference make your place look great and consider what our native birds and other species need.

## 2024/2025 Athletics Season

The 2024/2025 season is now in full swing, however it is still not too late to register. All registrations are done on line. Before the start of the season in Aberdeen, Archie Sellers-Bentley completed in the Treloar Shield held at Maitland and gained a first in both shot put and javelin.

Ruby Brochtrup competed at the All Schools Athletics event in Sydney where she gained the following results: 100m sprint 11th, high jump 6th 1.50m, triple jump 4th 10.79m and long jump where she received a bronze medal for her 3rd place, jumping 5.18m. Congratulations to both Archie & Ruby. Also during the off season, our club was lucky enough to receive a Junior Sports Grant from Glencore – this grant money was used towards the purchase of high jump mats for the athletes aged 10 years plus. The equipment arrived just in time for the first night of competition where they were put to good use. Thank you Glencore!

At the end of this month a number of Aberdeen athletes will be competing at the Hunter Zone Championships in Maitland. They will all be hoping to qualify for the next level of championships which will be Region. In order to gain this selection they must gain a 1st, 2nd or 3rd placing in the final of their selected event. Good luck to all those members competing.

## TIMETABLE CHANGES

PUBLIC transport users are being encouraged to check their travel plans after timetable changes came into effect on Sunday 20 October.

Major timetable changes for some parts of Sydney have had flow on impacts for regional and outer metropolitan passengers including adjustments to Intercity train services on the Newcastle-Central Coast and Hunter train lines.

There are some changes to Newcastle and Hunter bus timetables for routes that connect with train services. Some minor timing changes also affect selected NSW TrainLink booked regional train and coach services.

## BOAT SAFETY

Recreational water users are being called on to put safety first this boating season.

NSW Maritime, Marine Rescue NSW, NSW Police Marine Area Command and Surf Life Saving NSW have joined forces to encourage the wearing of lifejackets and making sure everybody on board a vessel wears one.

Statewide, there were 61 coastal drownings last financial year with 13 boating-related fatalities on Hunter waterways over the last five years, nine of those found to be people not wearing a lifejacket.

While the majority of mariners do the right thing, the top three offences on Hunter waterways over the last five years have been license offences or unregistered vessels, lifejacket non-compliance and improper or no safety equipment on board.

Water users are encouraged to Log On with Marine Rescue NSW before heading out via the free Marine Rescue NSW app or VHF Channel 16.

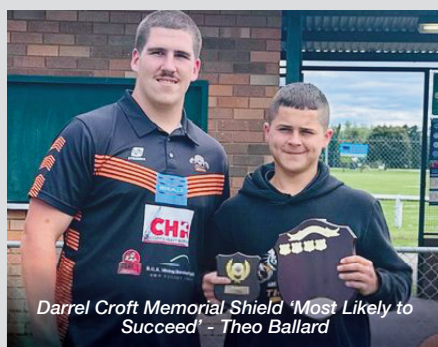
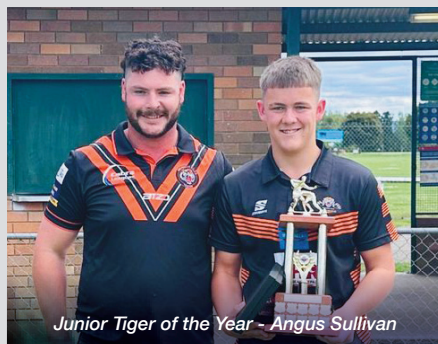
# Junior Tigers Celebrate Successful Year

- **Youth and Community Centre in Murrurundi:** Approved the construction of a new youth and community centre, including a covered basketball court and carpark, revitalising Wilson Memorial Park to serve as an inviting space for young people and families.

### STATE OF THE SHIRE REPORT 2021-2024

Council endorsed the State of the Shire Report, detailing Council's progress from 2021 to 2024. This report covers achievements across infrastructure, economic growth, community health, and environmental sustainability, providing a foundation for the new Council as it builds on these efforts to meet community goals.

### SCONE PARK GRANDSTAND UPGRADE PROPOSAL

Council endorsed the Scone Park Grandstand Upgrade proposal, a community-driven project led by the Scone Rugby League Club. The plan includes a new grandstand, function room, canteen, and updated change rooms.

Community feedback has shaped the design to include stormwater management, accessibility, and improved parking. With landowner's consent granted, the Rugby League Club can now pursue development approvals and apply for funding.

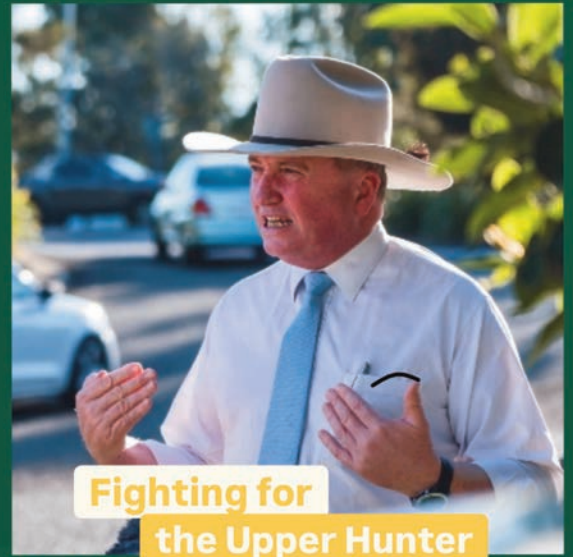
### CLOSED COUNCIL ITEMS

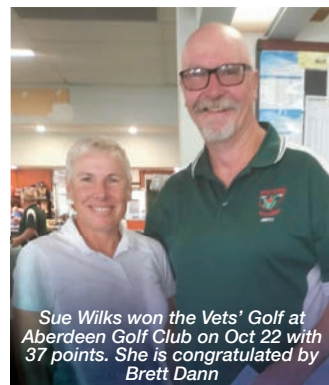
